Welcome to Trinity Episcopal Church! Today in our worship We are delighted to have the joy of celebrating the sacrament of Holy Baptism and renewal of our Baptismal Covenant.

Baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity and anointed with oil, Jackson will be marked as Christ's own forever and forever his life will be changed. Welcoming and accepting God's grace into one's life is the gift received through Christ in baptism.

In the Episcopal Church, we believe that we are made from and for goodness, and are called to share God's goodness and love with others. Our commitment to do so is outlined in our baptismal promises, summarized as follows: to care about our relationship with God through prayer, worship, and study; to care about our relationship with others by seeking to find goodness and showing goodness to all people; to strive to help bring in God's kingdom of justice and peace, and by resisting all evil in our world. Baptism commits our lives to this purpose.

While we as Episcopalians believe God is present in all moments, baptism is a sacrament, as is the Holy Eucharist, wherein we acknowledge the very presence of God (inward grace) through the outward signs of water and oil.

It is our prayer that all present here will experience God's goodness and grace in this time of worship. Please join us again, and consider making Trinity your church home for spiritual support, nurture, and service to the world.

PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE BAPTISMAL CANDIDATE

The Celebrant says

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Godparents

I present Jackson Glenn Shively to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents

I will, with God's help.

Celebrant

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents

I will, with God's help.

Celebrant

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Parents and Godparents

I renounce them.

Celebrant

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Parents and Godparents

I renounce them.

Celebrant

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Parents and Godparents

I renounce them.

Celebrant Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Parents and Godparents

I do.

Celebrant Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Parents and Godparents

I do.

Celebrant Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Parents and Godparents

I do.

Celebrant Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ?

Celebrant

Let us join with those who are committing Jackson to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.**

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,
in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent
and return to the Lord?

Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as your-
self?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the
dignity of every human being?

People **I will, with God's help.**

THE PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

The Celebrant then says to the congregation

Let us now pray for this child who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Intercessor Deliver him, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Intercessor Open his heart to your grace and truth.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Intercessor Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Intercessor Keep him in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Intercessor Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Intercessor Send him into the world in witness to your love.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Intercessor Bring him to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

The Celebrant says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Celebrant

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant who then pours water upon him for baptism, saying

Jackson Glenn Shively, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Celebrant Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Then the Celebrant places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying to him

Jackson Glenn, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

Then the Celebrant hands a lighted candle to the newly baptized saying

Jackson Glenn, receive the light of Christ so your light might shine among all people to the glory of God.

The Celebrant then says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant and People

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

THE PEACE

Celebrant The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People **And also with you.**

The Ministers and People greet one another in the name of Christ.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Because in Jesus Christ our Lord you have received us as your sons and daughters, made us citizens of your kingdom, and given us the Holy Spirit to guide us into all truth.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Then the Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

Celebrant and People

**We remember his death,
We proclaim his resurrection,
We await his coming in glory;**

The Celebrant continues

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**


The attendance for **September 8th** was **38** and the **offering** total was **\$2040**. We thank you for your faithful and generous giving.

Next Bible Study: Romans, beginning **Tuesday, Sept. 24 at 6 pm** in the Parish Hall. Cheese and bread will be provided.

Why Romans? It's a genuine Pauline epistle. Some of the letters (e.g., 1 & 2 Timothy and Titus) attributed to Paul are clearly not his. Another three are questionable. Since Paul is our earliest written source concerning Jesus, we'd like to see just what the real Paul thought was important to say about Jesus (and us). Jesus and Paul were both Jews. Jesus died a Jew. Through most of Paul's life, Christianity ("The Way") was a sect within Judaism. If Paul was not writing to explain how Judaism had gone astray (works vs. faith), what was he doing? For ourselves, some things shouldn't be missed. Romans 8: 31-39 is among the great spiritual truths that stand by themselves. There is more. Join us.

Resources: Our text is a list of discussion questions for Romans broken up into eighteen lessons. You may prefer also to use a study Bible or a commentary or to use an on line study guide. There are four leaders, two "on duty" at each session. Copies of *Romans, N.T. Wright for Everyone Bible Study Guides* will be available on the table in the cross aisle.



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
